CATHOLIC MISSION APPEAL THIS WEEKEND

As the Pope's international mission agency, Catholic Mission plays a vital role in responding to the call to love God and our neighbour by forming individuals and communities as missionary disciples of Jesus, sharing their faith in action and prayer.

Every October, during World Mission Month, Catholic Mission focus their appeal on one particular program. **This year they are partnering with The Arrupe Centre in north-western Cambodia.** Started in 2001 by the compassionate Bishop Enrique 'Kike' Figaredo Alvargonzalez, the Centre supports young residents with disabilities due to landmine incidents or other illnesses. Offering children the potential to live a full life by providing education, healthcare and opportunities for many, including a young man called Chen, whose life (and that of his family) was impacted so suddenly by a landmine incident which took both of his legs at the age of 16.

Dear friends in Christ,

The month of November is very important in the life of every faithful person. The month begins with the solemnity of **ALL SAINTS** on Sunday November 1 and **ALL SOULS'** feast which is celebrated on **November 2**. This Month is especially dedicated to remembering and praying for all the SOULS. I am of an opinion that we should pray for the dead all throughout the year, especially on the anniversary of their death, but in this month of the Holy Souls, we should devote some time every day to pray for the dead. I am sure we love them immensely even though they are no longer with us. Maybe we should start with ones who are closest to us; our parents, siblings and grandparents, but we should also offer prayers for all souls, especially for those most forsaken. Last year over 33 of our parish members entered eternal life.

We believe that those Holy Souls for whom we pray will continue to pray for us as they enjoy the eternal reward with their and our Master. I believe that our acts of charity toward the Holy Souls will ensure that they remember us before the throne of God when we are most in need of prayer. It's a comforting thought and one that should encourage us, especially in November, to offer our prayers for the Holy Souls.

In our parish you can do two things to pray for your loved ones who are deceased:

- * An offering of Masses for your loved ones for November. The envelopes are at the doors of the church. Please write the names of your loved ones clearly with a donation in it and they will be entered in the book of remembrance and prayed throughout all the Masses in November.
- * There is also a prayer card that you can write, the names of your loved ones, friends and deceased parishioners that you know and place it in the basket that is provided.

A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only, by visiting a church on 2nd November and praying the Lord's prayer and the Creed. Three conditions are required for gaining the indulgence: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the pope's intentions.

COVID-19 SAFETY

- New easing of restrictions allows places of worship to have up to 300 people, however funerals are still 100 and weddings 150.
- The number of people inside the church are limited to 150- 175, which allows for social distancing of 4 sm. This number excludes essential persons to the Liturgy
- There is now only one extra Mass in the Parish Hall with maximum of 50 parishioners on Sundays at 10 am.
- The aisles and pews are marked to facilitate the observance of social distancing practices. Please only sit where it is marked with a number on the pews.
- Please leave your name and contact details on the sign on sheet - these will be kept confidential- but are necessary in case anyone contracts the virus.
- Please sanitize your hands as soon as you enter the church.
- Please occupy the central seat of pews first, starting from the front pews of the church, so that others who come after you will be able to occupy the aisles while observing social distancing.
- Please continue to refrain from singing throughout liturgy.
- There will neither be a solemn entrance procession nor a recessional by the celebrant and ministers.
- No altar servers will be needed and there will be no procession of gifts, gifts will be kept at the credence table near the altar.
- The sign of peace will be exchanged without physical contact.
- During the communion, the social distancing will be observed and therefore communion will be brought to your seat. Communion should be received only in the hand.
- Only one acolyte/ senior server and one Extra-ordinary minister of communion would be required other than priests/ deacon to serve during the Mass.
- The collection baskets are kept at the entrances of the church and hall rather than passed during the Mass.
- As you prepare to exit the church please exit starting with the rows that are closest to the entrances.
- The obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is still lifted.
- It is important for everyone to maintain physical distancing and follow all health and safety guidelines. Our utmost concern is the health and well being of our parishioners. Therefore, those who are feeling ill, or who have symptoms of fever, cold, dry cough or sore throat should not come out to attend Mass but watch our live stream Mass at 10am on Sundays.
