BISHOP'S CHRISTMAS APPEAL | 28/29 DEC 2020

The Bishop's Christmas Appeal is an important opportunity for us to actively reach out to the most vulnerable and show the compassionate face of Christ to all. The Appeal highlights the important work of CatholicCare's Project Elizabeth, a comprehensive pregnancy-related counselling and support service run by CatholicCare for women and their families. Sharen was significantly affected by violent relationships, with only one of her children allowed to live with her. After an abusive child-

hood, Dale had turned to drugs and alcohol to numb the pain. When they met six years ago, they knew they had been given a chance to build a new life. Through CatholicCare, Dale and Sharen participated in family support and positive parenting programs. They were very happy with what they learnt and how much it improved their family relationships. After five years of trying to fall pregnant, their prayers for a baby of their own were finally answered. Determined not to be forced to give up their child, Dale and Sharen turned to CatholicCare again for help as soon as they found out they were having a baby. "Because of their history with domestic violence, Sharen and Dale wanted to make sure they had the best support and could do everything possible to ensure their baby was kept in their care," recalls Natalie Jacobi, CatholicCare's Project Elizabeth and Family Support Caseworker and Social Worker. With Natalie's help, they pre-



pared for the birth of their miracle baby through ongoing counselling, practical parenting groups and parenting strategies sessions. When little Jackson was born six weeks premature and had to spend several weeks in intensive care, CatholicCare caseworkers were there to support Sharen and Dale. They also helped connect the couple with hospital workers, social workers and community services to ensure they were able to take their son home and continue their new life as a loving family. Thanks to the care and support they found through CatholicCare, Sharen and Dale are building strong, loving relationships and are looking forward to a life of hope and joy with their new baby, Jackson. Next, Dale and Sharen hope to work with Natalie in a new one-on-one program called Bringing Baby Home. Designed for first-time parents and people with children from different relationships, it teaches parents about attachment connection, how to positively parent, and allows them to ask questions and seek support as they go. "I'd like to give Jackson a better childhood than mine," says Dale, "because my life wasn't too good. All I want for my son is to be around good people and to point him in a good direction as he gets older. Having the help from CatholicCare is amazing. Through the pregnancy we had Natalie, Frances and Linda, and the way they helped us was just brilliant. They're all just beautiful people - I've never met people like that before." With thanks to the support of your Parish and faith community, our CatholicCare team can help more vulnerable families in their efforts to give their children a positive start in life and be the best people they can be. We are always so grateful for your kind-hearted compassion and generosity, and with your continued help, we can provide the emotional and practical support that will enable our brothers and sisters in Christ to live their potential, in a true spirit of hope.


Ceramic Lamps for Sale (Holy Family)

SVDP CHRISTMAS HAMPERS

The Penrith Conference of the St Vincent de Paul Society invites parishioners to prepare Christmas hampers for the poor and disadvantaged families in the Penrith Area. Please see the Notice board for all details of Hamper categories, stickers and suggested items.

If you are watching Mass online, you do not have to pick up a sticker. You may prepare a hamper for a single, couple or a family with some of the suggested items: Tinned food, Long Life Milk, Biscuits, Cereal, Fruit cups, Chips, Soft drinks, Cup of soup, Tea/Coffee, Spreads (Vegemite, Jam etc), Christmas Bon bons, Paper plates, Napkins, Paper Towel, Toilet Paper, Rice or Pasta, Stir-fry or Pasta sauces. Etc. This is a guide only. If you would like to include other food items, please ensure they do not contain nuts or perishable items. Please ensue that food items are well within the expiry date and NO liquor is included in the hamper.

HAMPER RETURN: Hampers will need to be returned to the Parish Meeting Room 1 on Saturday 5th Dec or Sunday 6th December, approximately I hour before or after each mass.

HAMPER DELIVERIES: Once again, we ask for your generous help in the distribution of hampers. If you can spare an hour on: **Saturday the 12th Dec**, between 8am and 11:30am in PMR1. We will provide face masks, gloves, sanitiser etc, and we have a COVID-19 Safety Plan in place to ensure the safety of our parishioners. COVID-19 SAFETY

- •New easing of restrictions allows places of worship to have up to 300 people, however funerals are still 100 and weddings 150.
- •The number of people inside the church are limited to 150- 175, which allows for social distancing of 4 sm. This number excludes essential persons to the Liturgy
- ullet There is now only one extra Mass in the Parish Hall with maximum of 7D parishioners on Sundays at 1D am.
- •The aisles and pews are marked to facilitate the observance of social distancing practices. Please only sit where it is marked with a number on the pews. Groups to sit in smaller pews. There is no standing permitted.
- •Please leave your name and contact details on the sign on sheet these will be kept confidential- but are necessary in case anyone contracts the virus.
- Please sanitize your hands as soon as you enter the church.
- •Please occupy the central seat of pews first, starting from the front pews of the church, so that others who come after you will be able to occupy the aisles while observing social distancing.
- •There will neither be a solemn entrance procession nor a recessional by the celebrant and ministers.
- •No altar servers will be needed and there will be no procession of gifts, gifts will be kept at the credence table near the altar.
- •The sign of peace will be exchanged without physical contact.
- •During the communion, the social distancing will be observed and therefore communion will be brought to your seat. Communion should be received only in the hand.
- •Only one acolyte/ senior server and one Extra-ordinary minister of communion would be required other than priests/ deacon to serve during the Mass
- The collection baskets are now taken around by Wardens with a new basket with a long handle. This is to minimise touching the collection plate.
- $\bullet As$ you prepare to exit the church please exit starting with the rows that are closest to the entrances.
- •The obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is still lifted.
- •It is important for everyone to maintain physical distancing and follow all health and safety guidelines. Our utmost concern is the health and well being of our parishioners. Therefore, those who are feeling ill, or who have symptoms of fever, cold, dry cough or sore throat should not come out to attend Mass but watch our live stream Mass at 10am on Sundays.
