RCIA

The Gospel – The 12th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME Mark 4: 35-41.

Each of us experience fears that are difficult if not impossible to suppress. Today's Gospel is one we can connect with and relate to - the difficult circumstances which often exist in our spiritual and day-to-day lives.

The mystery relating to who Jesus really is, becomes apparent in this story. He calms a sudden storm which developed as he sailed across the Sea of Galilee with his disciples. Jesus' followers knew that only God could control the wind, the sea, and the other elements, and they realise what has just happened - Jesus has just exercised the same power that only God has over the elements. There can only be one possible explanation. Jesus has the power of God.

There seems to be two lessons in this week's readings. Not only did Jesus admonish the waves, but he also admonished the disciples for their lack of faith. The point of the story is, that nothing could harm the disciples while he was with them, just as today, many people find great comfort in sensing Jesus' constant presence in the most difficult times and crises.

Perhaps we are experiencing fear or anxiety in our lives, and we too need the peace of Jesus. But no matter what we are experiencing, we can find peace with the help of Jesus. The inner peace that only He can give, and no one or nothing can take away from us.

⊕ Read the Gospel slowly and reflectively – stopping.
where a word or phrase speaks to you. You may have read this passage many times, but perhaps this time, there will be a word - or feeling that you hadn't noticed before. If that

happens, stay with it and think about what it might mean for you at this time. Our "Catholic Life" topic Is "What does it mean to be a Christian."

COVID-19 SAFETY

- •Masks are highly recommended for places of wor-
- •Singing by the congregation is now permitted.
- •We are currently using the social distance of one person per 2 square meters. This excludes essential persons to the Liturgy.
- •Those who have visited a recent hotspot, who are feeling ill, or who have symptoms of fever, cold, dry cough or sore throat should not come out to attend Mass but watch our Facebook live stream Mass at 10am on Sundays. (@SNOMPenrith)
- •Upon arrival please scan the Service NSW QR code outside the church or see the Door Volunteers who will take your details electronically - these will be kept confidential- but are necessary in case anyone contracts the virus.
- •Ministers/volunteers who are essential to the Liturgy must arrive and sign on at least 15 minutes before Mass starting.
- •Please sanitize your hands as soon as you enter the church.
- •Once we have reached maximum capacity or the Mass has started, there will be no entry into the Church. Parishioners can choose to remain socially distanced outside whilst listening to Mass and receive communion outside.
- •Groups of 5 or more are to sit in the smaller pews, please follow the directions of the volunteers to socially distance. There is no standing permitted.
- •Those who enter a pew first should occupy the central seat, starting from the front pews of the church, so that others who come after you will be able to occupy the aisles while observing social distancing.
- •The sign of peace will be exchanged without physical contact.
- •We may now process down the aisles for Communion, making sure you keep a distance from the person in front of you. Communion should be received only in the hand.
- •Wardens have resumed taking up the 1st and 2nd collection. The collection baskets now have long handles to minimise contact. Thank you for your stewardship.
- •As you prepare to exit the church please exit starting with the rows that are closest to the entrances.
- •Please do not congregate in large groups outside the Church.
- •There is a separate QR Code for the Church, Hall and Parish Office. You must sign in to those areas, each time you enter.
- •The obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is still lifted.
