### GOSPEL REFLECTION © Greg Sunter

This week's gospel passage presents two miracle accounts, one, in effect, 'interrupting' or being framed by the other. Jesus is approached by the synagogue official, Jairus, to come and heal his dying daughter. In the milling and surging crowd, Jesus suddenly becomes aware of being touched by someone. The story of the woman with a haemorrhage is a story of social and religious isolation as much as it is a story of illness and pain. Because of the Jewish prohibitions against blood, the woman would have been regarded as permanently impure and unclean. She would have been unable to engage in any worship; she could not touch another person without also making them unclean; she was effectively outcast for the 12 years of her illness. She knew it would be forbidden for her to touch Jesus openly but took her chances of being unobserved in the crowd – she risked all on the belief that even touching Jesus' cloak might heal her. Jesus immediately stopped and drew attention to the woman. By doing so he made it clear to her that it was her faith that had healed her (a feature of healing stories in the Gospel of Mark). His actions also made it clear to the crowd that she was now healed and should not be shunned any longer; she was publicly declared fit to re-enter society and religious participation. After 12 years of virtual nonexistence, the woman was now able to begin her life again.

The delay, however, meant that Jairus' daughter was dead by the time Jesus arrived. Undeterred, Jesus performs another miracle and raises the girl from death. The girl was 12 years old - the same 12 years the woman suffered with a haemorrhage – and now she too was able to begin her life again. There is a neatness and a completeness about the two stories.

#### **Questions for Adults**

- Q. What is the common link between the two miracles in this gospel passage?
- Q. What do you imagine life would have been like for the woman with the haemorrhage?
- Q. What image of the disciples is presented in this passage?
- Q. What do we learn about the importance of faith?

#### WHATS HAPPENING IN RCIA

### The Gospel – The 14th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME Mark 6:1-6.

(Note: The RCIA will not be meeting for the next 2 weeks, but we invite you to share the gospel reflection we will reflect on privately during the break).

Jesus went back to Nazareth accompanied by his disciples. Jesus came home, but he wasn't AT home. When he taught in the synagogue on the Sabbath, the people are amazed; astonished at the wisdom with which he spoke, and at the power of the miracles they had heard he was performing. He may have expected that those closest to him would be the first to want to share good things with him - but it was not to be. He tried - but their lack of vision, intolerance and disbelief stifled even his ability to preach and to heal. This Gospel is more than a story of rejection, it is a story about how we ignore and reject God. It is a story about our reluctance to be helped by God, or by anyone else; reluctance which stems from our own perceptions, our own knowledge, our own strength our stubbornness.

Spiritual wholeness is not achieved by exercising our own human power, but in acknowledging our human weakness, and allowing God to affect his power in us. When we acknowledge our weakness and our need, and turn to God and ask for help, instead of relying on our own ability, perceived wisdom, and strength to save us, then something profound happens - we discover that God's grace is sufficient for us. God's power is made perfect in our weakness, and generally in ways we do not expect.

- ⊕In what ways have you been snubbed by those closest to you?
- ₱What impact does their opinion have on you?
- If you have ever treated old friends or family in the same way, how did that make you feel?
- ⊕How have your opinions and acts against others affected you and those around you?
- ♣Focus on the feelings you are experiencing. How can God help you in these areas?

#### **COVID-19 SAFETY**

- •Masks are mandatory in places of worship
- •Singing by the congregation is not permitted.
- •We are currently using the social distance of one person per 4 square meters. This excludes essential persons to the Liturgy.
- •Those who have visited a recent hotspot, who are feeling ill, or who have symptoms of fever, cold, dry cough or sore throat should not come out to attend Mass but watch our Facebook live stream Mass at 10am on Sundays. (@SNOMPenrith)
- •Upon arrival please scan the Service NSW QR code outside the church or see the Door Volunteers who will take your details electronically these will be kept confidential- but are necessary in case anyone contracts the virus.
- •Ministers/volunteers who are essential to the Liturgy must arrive and sign on at least 15 minutes before Mass starting.
- •Please sanitize your hands as soon as you enter the church
- •Once we have reached maximum capacity or the Mass has started, there will be no entry into the Church. Parishioners can choose to remain socially distanced outside whilst listening to Mass and receive communion outside.
- •Groups of 5 or more are to sit in the smaller pews, please follow the directions of the volunteers to socially distance. There is no standing permitted.
- •Those who enter a pew first should occupy the central seat, starting from the front pews of the church, so that others who come after you will be able to occupy the aisles while observing social distancing.
- •The sign of peace will be exchanged without physical contact.
- •A Eucharistic Minister or Priest will come to your pew to distribute Holy Communion. Please remain in your pew and stand as the Blessed Sacrament approaches.
- •Wardens have resumed taking up the 1st and 2nd collection. The collection baskets now have long handles to minimise contact. Thank you for your stewardship.
- •As you prepare to exit the church please exit starting with the rows that are closest to the entrances.
- •Please do not congregate in large groups outside the Church.
- •There is a separate QR Code for the Church, Hall and Parish Office. You must sign in to those areas, each time you enter.
- •The obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is still lifted.
