#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

A "one hit wonder" from 1989 was the song by Bobby McFerrin, Don't Worry, Be Happy. It was a laid-back, a cappella song that still frequently appears in film and television soundtracks. In some ways, the song became the catchcry of a generation who were overwhelmed by the pace of change that was occurring in society, technology and the world in general. A glance at today's gospel may leave the reader thinking that Jesus, too, is basically saying to us, don't worry, be happy. But the message of Jesus is not as simplistic as that. Instead, he says to us, set your hearts on God's kingdom first and on following God's will for justice in the world and, then, don't worry, be happy. It is not the same throwing of one's hands into the air as the 1980's song. It is not an abandonment of responsibility. Jesus says to us, trust in God, work to bring about the kingdom in our lives and in our world and only then leave the rest to God.

This gospel passage was aptly chosen by the Church

to mark the feast of St Mary of the Cross – Mary MacKillop. The teaching of Jesus, conveyed through the gospel passage, characterised much of the life and work of Mary MacKillop. Mary was a prolific writer, sending messages to her sisters in the schools and communities

across Australia. We are fortunate that many of these letters have been preserved and provide an incredible insight into the attitude of Mary MacKillop. One of the quotes attributed to Mary MacKillop that captures the essence of today's gospel is, "Do all you can with the means at your disposal and calmly leave the rest to God." (1891) Surely this is a more energising and empowering motto for life than don't worry, be happy?

#### **Historical Context - Mary MacKillop**

Mary MacKillop is not only the first Australian to be recognised by the Church as a Saint, she is truly a very Australian saint. She characterises the spirit of the Australian mythology. She was a prodigious hard worker who put the needs of others before herself. She exhibited something of the larrikin spirit: constantly in dispute with authority but pressing on, regardless. She used the strengths of others but also didn't tolerate those who were not genuine. Her commitment to the schooling of children from poor and

rural communities established a model of Catholic education that continues to today. A Saint for and of Australia!

#### RCIA | NEXT WEEKS GOSPEL REFLCETION

The Gospel -The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Luke 1:39-56.

The RCIA Group were able to come together via our first Zoom Meeting last Monday evening. It was so good to be able to see each other and share both the gospel reflection and catch up with our news. We are looking forward to sharing with each other via Zoom while the lockdown continues.

The Gospel this coming week includes the beautiful story of Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, and her song of praise, **The Magnificat**. As we celebrate her Assumption into heaven, we pray to Mary to help the people of our time to live with faith, hope and empathy: to seek God's kingdom in all we say and do. With her help may we be open to the presence and action of the Holy Spirit, who transforms our hearts, and enables us to become more open and compassionate to the freedom and dignity of every person.

Mary is the model Christian who truly heard the Word of God and lived it. Mary, being 'full of grace' led to her assumption, body, and soul into heaven. She was never 'weighed down' by the things that prevent us from having a closer relationship with God - sinfulness; excessive need for material things; greed; pride, vanity; self-promotion and indulgence. Mary was free from sin; poor in spirit, forever pure, humble,

and free from self-love that contrasts and conflicts with the love of God.

One way for us to surrender ourselves to God and be filled with the presence of God like Mary, is through daily prayer. Praying will calm us and enable us to 'tune in' to God and to our blessed Mother. It is only through prayer that we can truly unite ourselves with Mary by expressing her sentiments:

> "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my Saviour because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid."
