- Loose collections





SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY



In their Social Justice Statement, *Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples,* they join with the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) to call on us to develop relationships of humility and love with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

The statement tells us about the painful experiences of many First Nations people. It is very challenging reading in parts. We are followers of Christ whose central message is that love is the way. Prominent Aboriginal lawyer, Noel Pearson, is quoted in the statement as saying that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people feel unloved. How difficult must that be? We can't just turn a blind eye to this.

We are going to vote in the Voice referendum before the end of the year. NATSICC supports a Yes vote, but the Bishops will not tell us how to vote. However, they do urge us to inform ourselves about the issues and to engage in respectful dialogue about the issues, especially with First Nations People. This is one moment when we can try harder to listen to First Nations People and learn from them about their experiences and hopes.
