Dear Friends in Christ,

As we begin Holy Week, we are reminded of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, greeted with palm branches and cries of "Hosanna!" This week, our Eucharistic celebration commences with the Blessing of Palms and a procession, echoing Christ's entrance into Jerusalem. This tradition evokes childhood memories for me, as I joyfully recall waving palms during our procession through the streets of my hometown. Beyond being mere symbols, palms and olive branches serve as tangible expressions of our faith in Jesus Christ, the Messianic King, and His victory over sin and death.

In medieval times, people believed that the blessed palms offered protection from harm. Today, we keep palms and olive branches in our homes as testimony to our faith in Christ and His paschal triumph. The Palm Sunday Liturgy holds significant importance in our faith life, serving as a poignant reminder of Christ's love and sacrifice, demonstrated through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

This week, as Christians, we will participate in various events central to our faith. On Wednesday evening at 7pm, our cathedral will host the Chrism Mass, where the Bishop will bless the three Sacred Oils used throughout the year in sacraments such as, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Anointing of the Sick.

I invite you all to prepare yourselves for the Sacred Triduum.

This coming Tuesday, we have arranged for the Second Rite of Reconciliation at 7pm. God's mercy and compassion beckon us to the confessional, preparing us to enter Holy Week more deeply.

During the Paschal Triduum, we commemorate the central mysteries of our faith: the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. These are not merely historical events but living realities that continue to transform our lives today. Let us immerse ourselves in these sacred days, walking with Jesus through His suffering, death, and ultimate triumph over sin and death.

On Holy Thursday at 7pm, we will celebrate the Lord's Supper. The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord commences with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, a pivotal moment in the Easter vigil.

On Easter Saturday, during Easter Vigil Mass at 7pm, we will bless the Easter fire, light the Paschal Candle, read salvation history, celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation for catechumens, and welcome candidates into full communion with the Catholic Church. The renewal of baptismal promises for the faithful is once again an integral part of Holy Week celebrations. This year, we have two catechumens for baptism and three candidates entering into full communion with the Catholic Church. Let us continue to pray for them as they continue their faith journey alongside the RCIA team.

I urge you to prioritize attending the Paschal Triduum celebrations. Let us not allow this opportunity to pass us by. The Great Three Days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter call us to be transformed by love. May God bless you abundantly during this sacred time.

Leaia and her family now have a water tank at their home in Samoa. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions.

Memory completed her vocational training course in carpentry and joinery. After completing a work contract at one of the largest electrical companies in Malawi, Memory now plans to return to her village and provide carpentry services to people in her community.
