#### PROJECT COMPASSION

Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.

Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in -law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water caused Leaia a lot of worry.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Leaia had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa,



which will further improve their health and living conditions.

#### LENTEN SYMBOL



The symbolism of the mother pelican feeding her young with her own blood is called a "Pelican in her Piety". Christians see parallels between the mother pelican and Jesus and his followers. When food is in short supply the pelican pierces its

breast with its sharp pointed beak and the side of Jesus was pierced by a sharp pointed lance (Jn 19:34a). Blood flowed from the pelican's breast, blooded flowed from Jesus' side (Jn 19:34b). The mother's blood is drink for her chicks, and the blood of Jesus is "true drink" (Jn 6:55b). The mother gives her life that her chicks might live, and Jesus laid down his life that we might live (Jn 15:23). The body and blood of Jesus is salvation and eternal life for those who receive it. The mother pelican and her chicks have come to represent the Eucharist, as well as redemption and salvation.

# UPDATE ON CRAIG AND ROSE WALSH'S TRIP TO INDIA.



We travelled to India on the 25<sup>th</sup> of January for a short two weeks, to catch up with the local people who care for all the infrastructure that we had established during our twenty years of missionary work, and we thank all those

parishioners and Priests who were praying for us. We also thank the Legion of Mary members who gave us a couple of hundred rosary beads, as both adults and children use them with pride, every day. The rosaries were so popular that they have asked us to post many more to them.



The highlight of our trip was without doubt our visit to a leper colony in Adilabad, where the lepers must live separately in their own little huts, which is on the outskirts of the town. We gave them new stainless-steel plates, new cloths, some food, money, and we prayed for each of them. But what pleased them most was our loving touch and hugs, just as Father Joe pointed out at 8.30 Mass on the  $11^{\rm th}$  of February, after the  $1^{\rm st}$  reading and the Gospel about lepers in Jesus's time in Israel. We felt so very privileged and honoured, because really, we have no idea how truly difficult life would really be for them, when we live so comfortably at home.

#### **HOURS OF GRACE**

Hours of Grace (HOG) is a national initiative of Jesus Youth Australia commenced in 2011. It is a chain of perpetual adoration that occurs during the Paschal season, from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost across many Australian cities.

These are moments of grace where Jesus invites each one of us into an intimate encounter for a loving embrace. It is a personal invitation to all who love him through this Heavenly Sacrament.

Individuals and groups are encouraged to come together for prayer. The church will remain open the entire time and the Blessed Sacrament will be on the Altar except during liturgies and meetings.

A roster is available at the entrance of the church for those who wish to sign on in advance for a selected period of time. I hope this will be a wonderful time of prayer for everyone.


